

## Welcome!

Hotel Nestor is named after the last farmer here on the property, and my greatgrandfather, Nestor Johansén. The property belongs to the farm Arvids-Västergård, which dates back to the early 1700s.

Hotel Nestor is today run as a family business and was founded in 2009 by my parents; Artist Pia Rousku and Industry Designer Frank Hellgren.

Now the hotel is owned and run by me, William Hellgren. I became a part of the hotel business in 2016 when I opened my restaurant , Back Pocket, in the building's renovated barn The original part of this building, built of cinder stone from Dalsbruk in Kimito, was built around 200 years ago and has been home to the farm's cows, pigs and hens for several decades up to 1974, when the farming activities on the property came to an end.

Over the next 25 years, the farm was largely uninhabited and served as the summer residence for the family, who for many years had been living in Stockholm, Sweden.



In 1999, a new chapter in the old farm's history began when my family chose to realize an old dream of replacing their hectic city life with a rural existence. They wanted to go back to their original roots at the old family farm in the Turku archipelago.

Once here, the idea of giving the old barn a new life grew stronger and stronger. The result stood ready in the summer of 2009, when the new hotel was opened and a new chapter in its already 200 years old story began..

Today, old memories still echo within the thick stone walls of the old barn building, while life continues stronger than ever. New meetings are taking place and new stories begin in my ancestors' old barn, which became a hotel.

I was raised in a home of artists, where art and culture have always been around. As long as I can remember, I have known that I wanted to work with art and creativity. After trying different disciplines, I finally found my own artistic identity as a chef.



Korpoström Archipelago Center is a visitor center for science, nature, art and culture. The Archipelago center works in an interdisciplinary manner to create exhibitions and happenings with interesting angles of approach on matters and phenomena that are peculiar to the archipelago.

The people co-operating are scientists, artists, cultural workers, volunteers and public officials. Korpo Church, named after the Archangel Mikael, is an important part of our national cultural heritage both architecturally and for its interior. The building was completed in its present form around the year 1450. During the summer months, the church is open to the public every day between 10 am and 5 pm.

Korpo Local Folklore Museum is located approx 800 m from the Korpo market square towards Hväsby at Strömmavägen 39. In the lush grounds there are ten different buildings which were moved there from different parts



of the island. These include a farmstead, store rooms and a windmill. There is also a fishing hut located down on the museum shore. The museum is maintained and run by the local people on a voluntary basis to conserve and preserve an older way of life in Korpo for future generations.
